





- Seven out of 10 youth have accidentally come across pornography online.¹
- One in seven kids has received a sexual solicitation online.²
- 72% of teens have a social networking profile and nearly half (47%) have a public profile viewable by anyone.³
- 43% of teens aged 13 to 17 report that they have experienced some sort of cyberbullying in the past year.⁴
- About 1 in 5 (19%) of teens have engaged in some kind of sexting.⁵
- 1 in 5 children under the age of 7 use the Internet without parental supervision.⁶

Virginia Pilot Program

In 2008, EIE began a pilot of the Internet Safety 101SM program in partnership with the Virginia PTA and the Virginia Verizon Foundation, reaching over 5,000 parents, educators and other caring adults. 95% of participants surveyed were motivated to take preventative steps to protect children from online threats.
